Connecting kids to clubs

Involvement in sport and recreational activities is great for children and young people. Participation helps improve physical development and motor skills as well as enhancing health, wellbeing and social skills. Connection to friends and community helps young people to stay engaged with school and learning. Studies show however that around half of children living in disadvantaged communities do not participate in such activities.

Tomorrow Today has worked closely with local clubs and groups to introduce a funding support system so that financial hardship in local families is not a barrier to their children's participation. More than 100 children and young people were able to sample activities available in Benalla, thanks to local clubs and groups who staged activities for our 2017 'Come and Try' day (pictured above). Funding has then helped students to join a sporting club or hobby group or participate in cultural activities such as music, art, dance and drama.

Since it began last year, this initiative has connected over 200 students (from Foundation to Year 12) to more than 20 different local clubs. At least one-third of the students assisted to participate had not undertaken that activity before. And this boost in numbers has been a significant benefit for Benalla's clubs, some of which were struggling to attract new members. Great for kids and for clubs.

With the goodwill

and 'can-do' attitude of our rural community, there is a remarkable level of activity underway to ensure that local children have every opportunity to thrive, despite Benalla's high level of disadvantage. We thank the donors, volunteers, partners across the local community and funders from beyond Benalla, who have joined us in this whole of community approach to improving educational outcomes.

In an exciting development that will provide enduring community benefit, Tomorrow Today will be purchasing the Cecily Court property where we are currently based (read more on page 3). As with our Education Benalla Program, external philanthropic funding is vital to make the purchase possible; but we also need local support. I hope you will consider digging deep, to secure the financial sustainability of this wonderful independent organisation that is achieving so much for Benalla and district.

Child by Child

Benalla P-12 College primary school students invited PEEP children to join them for a fun reading and craft session at the Benalla library. Both age groups benefitted from the activities.

In Australia, by Grade 3, there are wide differences in children's levels of achievement in reading and mathematics. Some children are already well behind year-level expectations, and many of these children remain behind throughout their schooling. They are locked into trajectories of 'underperformance' that often lead to disengagement, poor attendance and early exit from school. There is little evidence that, as a nation, we are doing a better job of reducing the numbers of students on long-term trajectories of low achievement or of reducing the resulting 'tail' of student underperformance. Benalla is challenging the national trend, thanks to Tomorrow Today and over 140 participating local agencies, schools and community groups. Every week during school term more than 100 families take part in one of our PEEP (Parents Early Education Partnership) sessions. Additionally, we work with schools to train and support "Reading Buddies" to work in the classroom, one-on-one with identified children; and we support a wide range of in-community and in-school activities to build connection and aspiration.
