Lifelong benefits

We know that many children growing up in communities like ours, where there is significant financial hardship, have lower educational, health and 'life' outcomes than those from more advantaged communities. Tomorrow Today is part of a major effort in Benalla to respond to the effects of disadvantage. This community effort is now paying off! Recent results from the national survey of childhood development - Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) - show a dramatic improvement in the school readiness of Benalla's children.

In 2015 one third of our children were assessed as developmentally vulnerable on commencing school. They were not 'ready to learn'. Benalla had the worst results of 79 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Victoria. In an amazing turnaround for a disadvantaged community, Benalla's 2018 results have improved significantly, with less than one quarter of children deemed vulnerable; and now ranking 19th of 79 LGA's. Benalla made greater improvement in levels of vulnerability than 75 of the other 78 Victorian LGAs.

The dramatic improvement in Benalla's AEDC results can be attributed to Benalla's strong community collaboration. Agencies in the 'early years' field are working together with the common aim that 'all Benalla children start school ready to learn'. Tomorrow Today's PEEP (Parents Early Education Partnership) program is central to this approach. Our weekly facilitated playgroup now has over 200 Benalla families with children 0-5 attending annually. Supporting children's early years - when their brains are developing rapidly - brings lifelong benefits.

Benalla's outstanding improvement in child development results are a fabulous demonstration of the power of a community working together with a common purpose.

It is incredibly heartening to see this progress, while staying committed to the further effort needed.

We are indebted to the large number

of volunteers who give their time to help deliver results for Benalla's kids. And it's wonderful to see our newly formed 'Friends' group off to a great start, pledging their time and talent to assist the Foundation.

Tomorrow Today provides the structure to 'give where you live' to make a real difference in Benalla.

Young people creating solutions

Dedicated, creative, highly motivated, team-players are some of the words that spring to mind when describing the thirty young people aged 11-16 years involved in Tomorrow Today's first ever Digital Project. Their brief was to design and develop a digital solution, like an 'app' or website, to a local issue of importance to them. Students would be strengthening their skills for future work while supporting their community.

The students participated in three workshops held at Tomorrow Today outside of school hours. Sessions were facilitated by Seer Data & Analytics, an organisation at the forefront of finding innovative ways to tackle social problems. The ideas developed were put out to the broader youth community, with over 280 local young people providing input. The spectacular result is 'Benalla Works', launched on 9th May 2019 at the Hands On Trades Expo at Winton Motor Raceway.

Benalla Works is a Benalla specific website for young people, aged 15-25 years, that enables them to search for local employment, work experience and volunteering opportunities. Young people are able to sign up to the secure site and upload their resume. Businesses are able to post job and volunteering opportunities.
